Structure 13/02, Broadfording Road over Troupe Run, Martin's Crossroads, Hagerstown, Washington County, is a single lane concrete culvert which was built in November 1913 by Henry H. Martin, who owned the property,. This small structure consists of two concrete parapets, which have three repeating incised rectangles on both the interior and exterior faces of each parapet. There are also abutments, a head wall, a tail wall and wing walls, and the span is ten feet long, with a road width of under fifteen feet. The vaulting of the structure appears to be corbeled, as opposed to being a true arch. The Broadfording Road small structure retains its integrity of materials, location, design and workmanship. However, the setting, association and feeling have been compromised by the continual subdivision of the farm into residential lots, and the shift from a rural landscape to a more suburban area of Washington County. The Trust also considered whether the small structure would qualify for the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C, architecture and engineering. Although the Broadfording Road structure has local significance, it does not demonstrate qualities which would make it unique among small structures from the first quarter of the twentieth century. Therefore, Structure 13/02, Broadfording Road over Troupe Run, is not eligible for inclusion in the National Register.
