H.H. Martin House and property, WA-I-334, located at Martin's Crossroads, Broadfording Road and Maryland Route 63, Hagerstown, Washington County, which was surveyed in 1977 by the Trust, reportedly has a log house encased in brick and stone. At the present time, the house has three sections, the three-bay, side entrance main pile, a center L addition to the rear, and another two story side addition. This last is now covered with aluminum siding with a two story bay-window front, and it sits on a stone foundation.. The roof is standing seam metal, and the windows vary from two over two to six over six sashes. There are three interior chimneys, one of which appears to have been repaired sometime in the past. The front porch has a shed roof which is held up by four square columns. The front facade is marred by the addition of a stair which leads to the second floor, although there is no entrance at that level. Because of the numerous additions, and the change in the setting of the Martin House through the continual subdivision of the property, the Martin House also is **not eligible** for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm is located in the northeast quadrant of the intersection of Maryland Route 63 and the Broadfording Road, south of Cearfoss and west of Hagerstown in Washington County. The house is situated on sloping ground and faces south.

The dwelling is a two story, four bay brick cased log structure with a three bay wing or ell of brick extending to the rear or north. A late 19th or early 20th century frame addition with a semi-hexagonal projecting bay is attached to the east end wall.

The front section of the house is sheathed with stretcher bricks. Four openings are placed across the south wall at the first story while two are present at the second story level. Windows have narrow casings which hold two over two pane double hung sashes some of which are flanked with pairs of louvered shutters. Entrances are located in the two end bays of the front elevation. Both appear to be framed similarly to the windows and includes narrow transoms above identical doors with large glass panes in their upper sections. A one story porch supported by square pillars extends across the front elevation.

The wing which stretches to the north has a partially enclosed double porch along its west wall. The frame addition is sheathed with German siding and has turn of the century style flat topped window architraves.

The roofs of the main section and wing are sheathed with sheet metal. At the front section the roof protrudes beyond the end walls. A brick chimney is located inside the east end wall and a patch in the roof suggests that another flue may have been located inside the west end. A corbeled chimney and small belfrey extend from the roof of the wing.

South of the house near Broadfording Road is a large frame bank barn resting on fieldstone foundations. It has projecting brick granaries with decorative patterned ventilators.

The buildings appear to be in fair to good condition and stand on a tract containing 31.83 acres. A cemetery is said to be located behind the house.

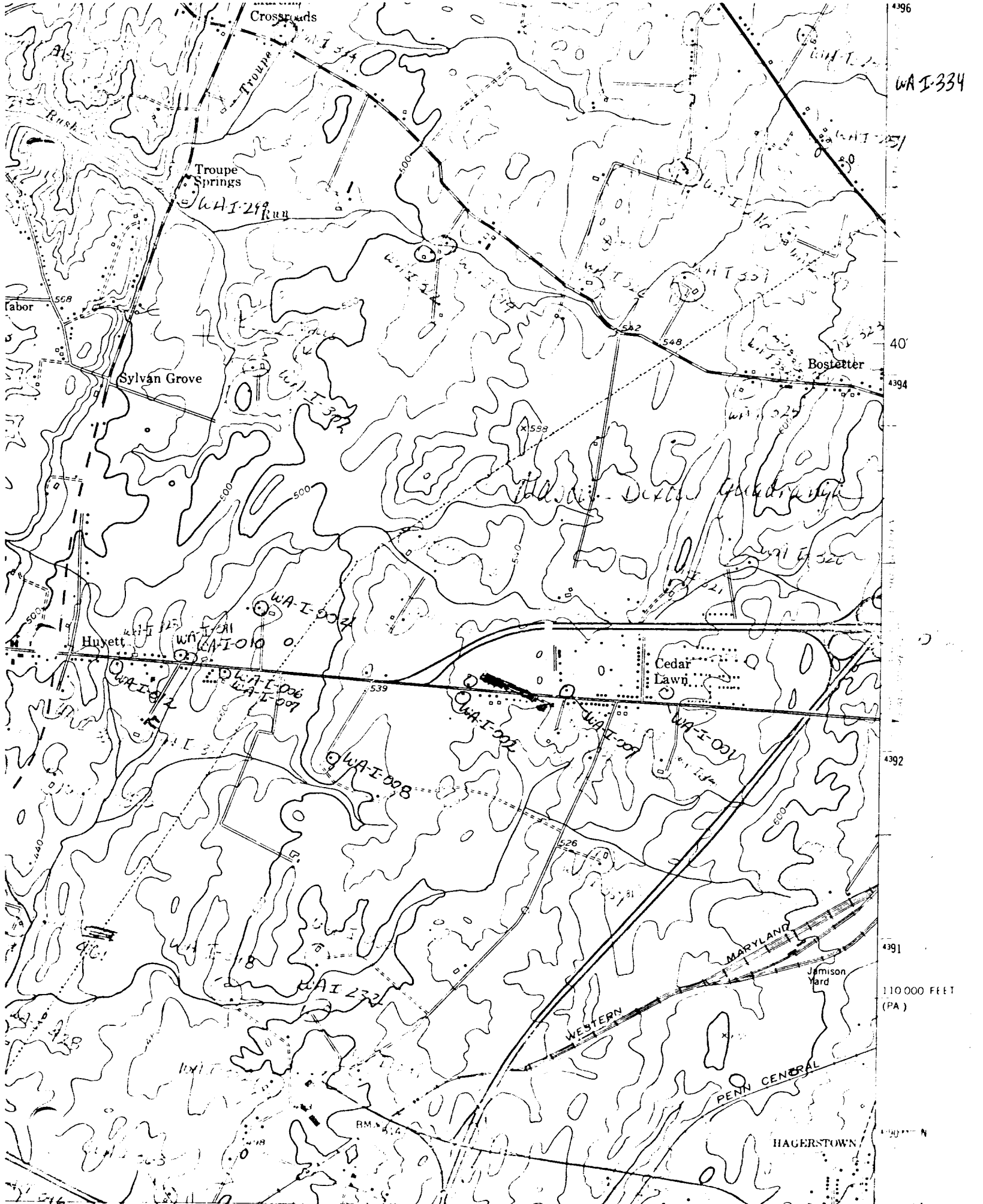
